RE: PETITION OF TEXAS PACIFIC COAL AND OIL COMPANY TO AMEND THE SPECIAL FIELD RULES PERTAINING TO LAGRANGE FIELD ADAMS COUNTY, AND TO ADOPT AN AMENDMENT TO THE SPECIAL FIELD RULES TO DESIGNATE THE 4300 FOOT POOL AS A SEPARATE POOL OR RESERVOIR IN THE LAGRANGE FIELD ADAMS COUNTY, MISSISSIPPI AND TO FIX THE MAXIMUM EFFICIENT RATE OF PRODUCTION AND ALLOCATION OF PRODUCTION IN THE 4300 FOOT POOL OF THE LAGRANGE FIELD ADAMS COUNTY, MISSISSIPPI.

O R D E R

The above matter coming on to be heard before the State Oil and Gas Board of Mississippi at its regular September, 1956 meeting in the Second Floor Auditorium of the Woolfolk State Office Building, North West Street, Jackson, Mississippi on the application of Texas Pacific Coal and Oil Company for an amendment to the Special Field Rules of the LaGrange Field, Adams County, Mississippi so as to include, designate and define the 4300 foot pool as a separate pool or reservoir in the LaGrange Field of Adams County, Mississippi and for the fixing of the maximum efficient rate of production and allocation of production in the 4300 foot pool of the LaGrange Field Adams County, Mississippi; and the Board having maturely considered the petition of the applicant, and being fully advised in the premises, on evidence adduced, and finding that the Board has jurisdiction hereof, and that due and legal notices have been published, in accordance with the law and the rules and regulations of the Board, and further finding that the relief prayed for should be granted;

And the Board further finding that those strata of the Wilcox formation productive of oil from the depths of 4350 to 4376 feet (-3990 to -4016 feet sub-sea) as found in the Texas Pacific Coal and Oil Company No. 7 O. L. Wilson well in the Eastern corner of Section 7, Township 6

North, Range 2 West, Adams County, Mississippi are strata lying in a pool or reservoir, which is separate and distinct from the other pools or reservoirs from which wells are producing in said LaGrange Field;

And the Board further finding that the wells at present producing from such strata and correlated with such strata as is found in the Texas Pacific Coal and Oil Company No. 7 O. L. Wilson well in the Eastern corner of Section 7, Township 6 North, Range 2 West, Adams County, Mississippi, are the following:

Calto Oil Company - Magnolia Petroleum Co. - No. 2 Fry Unit - Reale Heirs, Sec. 19, Twp. 6 N, R. 2 W.

and that such wells are actually producing from a pool or reservoir which is separate and distinct from any and all other pools or reservoirs heretofore defined in the Special Field Rules heretofore adopted by this Board for LaGrange Field;

It is therefore hereby ordered and adjudged that the said pool, which is now productive in the Texas Pacific Coal and Oil Company No. 7 O. L. Wilson well in the Eastern corner of Section 7, Township 6 North, Range 2 West Adams County, Mississippi, and those strata which may be correlated therewith, is a separate and distinct oil pool, completely disconnected from any of the other producing pools or reservoirs in said field.

It is further ordered and adjudged that the title to Order No. 137-52 be amended and corrected to read as follows:

"Special Field Rules for Baker, S. Wilson, Parker, N. Baker, N. E. Baker, Ratcliff, Benbrook, N. E. Benbrook, 4600 foot pool, North 4600 foot pool, Reale Heirs Pool, and 4300 foot pool, LaGrange Field, Adams County, Mississippi."

It is further ordered and adjudged that the Special Field Rules for Adams County, Mississippi as heretofore adopted on August 20, 1952 by Order No. 137-52, as same may have been thereafter amended or implemented, be and the same are hereby amended to add to Rule B thereof one additional pool to be named and identified as the 4300 foot pool as distinguished from the pools heretofore identified and classified

by the Special Field Rules for LaGrange Field Adams County, Mississippi, such 4300 foot pool being classified and defined as follows:

The 4300 foot pool, as used herein, shall be construed to mean those strata of the Wilcox Formation productive of oil from the depths of 4350 to 4376 feet (-3990 to -4016 sub-sea) in the Texas Pacific Coal and Oil Company No. 7 O. L. Wilson Well in the Eastern corner of Section 7, Township 6 North, Range 2 West, Adams County, Mississippi; and those strata which may be correlated therewith.

It is further ordered that the maximum efficient rate of production and the allocation of production for the 4300 foot pool be and the same is hereby affixed as follows:

4300 FOOT POOL - MER - '65 barrels of oil per day per well.
