## THE STATE OIL AND GAS BOARD OF MISSISSIPPI

IN RE: DOCKET NO. 176-77-80

LAKE MARY FIELD, WILKINSON  
COUNTY, MISSISSIPPIORDER

This day this cause came on for hearing at the regular August, 1977 meeting of the State Oil and Gas Board of Mississippi upon Application for Amendment to Special Field Rules, Lake Mary Field, Wilkinson County, Mississippi, and for such other relief as set forth in the said application.

The State Oil and Gas Board finds that due and legal notice of the meeting of the Board for the purpose of considering the above application has been given in the manner and form provided by law and in the rules and regulations of this Board, and that due and proper proofs of all legal and required notices are on file with this Board in this cause, and that the Board has full jurisdiction of this cause and of the parties, and the right to hear said cause and determine the same at this meeting of the Board; that the Board has heard the evidence of witnesses, both oral and documentary and the argument of counsel; that no objections were made to the application; said Board being fully advised in the premises, does find that Petitioner has filed a properly verified application and that the relief sought in said application should be granted in the manner and form hereinafter set forth; and the Board further finds as follows:

1. That Applicant is the operator of four oil-producing wells in Lake Mary Field, which wells are currently producing from different oil pools in the Wilcox formation as set forth below:

- a. E. M. Kee #4 - Alexander oil pool
- b. E. M. Kee #1 - Baker "A" oil pool
- c. E. M. Kee #3 - Baker "B" oil pool
- d. E. M. Kee #4a- Parker "C" oil pool

That the above four wells are the only oil-producing wells in Lake Mary Field.

2. That Special Field Rules for Lake Mary Field were developed by this Board on February 15, 1956, by Order No. 29-56, which Rules defined the Minter oil pool and the Kee oil pool. That the Special Field Rules were amended and supplemented on March 20, 1957, by Order No. 63-57, wherein the Parker "C" oil pool was defined. That the said Rules were further amended and supplemented on February 18, 1959 by Order No. 43-59, wherein the Walker oil pool and the Parker "B" oil pool were defined. That the said Rules were further amended on September 16, 1959 by Order No. 221-59, wherein the Parker "A" oil pool was defined.

3. That there are eleven separate and distinct oil pools in Lake Mary Field, as follows: Minter; Kee; Parker "A", "B", and "C"; Walker and Walker "D"; Baker "A" and "B"; Alexander; McKittrick. That as hereinabove shown, six of the said eleven oil pools have been previously defined by this Board. That although five of the said eleven oil pools have never been defined, all said five oil pools have been, or are being produced. That Applicant intends to further produce some or all of the said pools, and therefore requests that the Special Field Rules be amended so as to include the following language:

The following oil pools should be construed to be those strata of the Wilcox formation productive of oil in the approximate intervals stated in the John W. McGowan, E. M. Kee #4 well in the NW $\frac{1}{4}$  of NE $\frac{1}{4}$  Section 29, Township 3N, Range 4W, Wilkinson County, Mississippi, and those sands productive of oil correlative therewith.

1. McKittrick oil pool - 7363 - 7376 ft.
2. Baker "A" oil pool - 7433 - 7440 ft.
3. Baker "B" oil pool - 7461 - 7463 ft.
4. Walker "D" oil pool - 7596 - 7599 ft.
5. Alexander oil pool - 7762 - 7784 ft.

That attached to the Application as Exhibit "A" is a true copy of the log of the said E. M. Kee #4 well upon which log Applicant indicated the eleven oil pools aforesaid, and particularly the five oil pools which Applicant seeks to have defined herein.

4. That with the exception of the above recommended amendment or supplement to the Special Field Rules, said rules should remain in force and effect as written; further, that the proposed changes will promote the development and production in the field, will prevent waste, and will protect the coequal and correlative rights of all parties in the field.

IT IS THEREFORE ORDERED AND ADJUDGED that an order is entered amending and supplementing the Special Field Rules for Lake Mary Field, Wilkinson County, Mississippi, by defining the five said oil pools above stated in the manner and form set forth above.
